

Rules we will follow on Pack Camping Trips

The Outdoor Code

As an American, I will do my best to -

- **Be clean in my outdoor manners.** I will treat the outdoors as a heritage. I will take care of it for myself and others. I will keep my trash and garbage out of lakes, streams, fields, woods, and roadways.
- **Be careful with fire.** I will prevent wildfire. I will build my fires only where they are appropriate. When I have finished using a fire, I will make sure it is cold out. I will leave a clean fire ring, or remove all evidence of my fire.
- **Be considerate in the outdoors.** I will treat public and private property with respect. I will use low-impact methods of hiking and camping.
and
- **Be conservation minded.** I will learn how to practice good conservation of soil, waters, forests, minerals, grasslands, wildlife, and energy. I will urge others to do the same.

Outdoor Fire Safety

Know and practice the rules of outdoor fire safety.

1. Follow all rules of your campsite.
2. Clear all burnable materials within 10 feet of your fire.
3. Never leave your fire unattended.
4. Have bucket of water nearby.
5. When you're finished, make sure the fire is DEAD OUT.
 - a. spread coals & ashes out
 - b. sprinkle them with water
 - c. stir & sprinkle until the site is COLD

Other General Rules:

- **There will be no playing with the campfire. Please do not start a fire without an adult stationed there at all times.**
- **Parents are responsible for their children's behavior at all times. Please keep track of where they are and what they are doing.**
- **According to park rules, there is No alcohol, No firearms, No pets, No water balloons**
- **Use the buddy system - especially outside (don't wander off from the camp area alone)**
- **There are No video games, game boys or other electronic entertainment permitted at Cub Camping events.**
- **Treat all adults as leaders - with respect**

Pack Camping Guidelines

When – Friday, June 2 - Camp is available for set up at 4 PM but no official activities are planned for this day. **Food is on your own.** Saturday, June 3 - Begin with a flag ceremony, followed by breakfast, then FUN, games, hikes, etc. Dinner will begin at 5:30 PM. The campout concludes on Sunday morning after Breakfast. (We must vacate by 1 pm.)

Saturday, Family Campfire Attendees - We will have games, hikes, a potluck dinner, and campfire. Planned events will begin at 4:00 p.m. for those only coming to the campfire. Families are welcome to come for the day on Sat. after 10:00 a.m. Enjoy all the fun, but you must let me know you'll be there for food.

Where – Camp Guyasuta, Sharpsburg, PA —(Directions will be included in this packet.) There is one central fire. Each family must provide their own tent and sleeping bags. Most other things are provided. See list of what to bring. There is a bath house that has running water, flush toilets, and electricity.

Dinner – The Cub Scouts will have hamburgers, chili, and hot dogs for dinner on Saturday evening. We would like to round out the meal with a potluck. Please bring a side dish or desert to share. S'more supplies will be provided. Bring your own table service and cups. (No alcohol is allowed in the park.)

Suggestions:

- **Bring sunscreen and insect repellent. It will be BUG season.**
- **Bring a water bottle to make it easy for the boys to carry around with them during the day on Saturday.**
- **There is no drinkable water at the campsite, bring what you need. There is running water, but we are not certain it is good for drinking. We will provide some water, but if you prefer bottled, bring it.**
- **Bring lawn chairs and/or something to sit on. Keep in mind it might be muddy.**
- **Bring your normal camping equipment including tents, sleeping bags, flashlights, rain ponchos, drinks for your family, water, etc. See CHECKLIST.**

A check list is also included with this packet.

Meals

Friday Dinner: NOT PROVIDED, pack sandwiches, or eat before you arrive.

Sat Breakfast: pancakes, sausage, juice, fruit

Saturday Lunch: Foil or stick cooking, boys will make their own. All supplies will be provided. Hamburger, potatoes, carrots, onions, cheese, spices.

Sat Dinner: Dinner will be hotdogs, burgers and chili. We would like to round out the meal with a potluck. Please bring a side dish or desert to share. S'more supplies will be provided. **Bring your own table service and cups.** (No alcohol is allowed in the park.)

Sun Breakfast: eggs, sausage, potatoes, juice. We will use foil cooking.

Snacks: fruit, nuts, popcorn, marshmallows, cookies

Directions to Camp Guyasuta

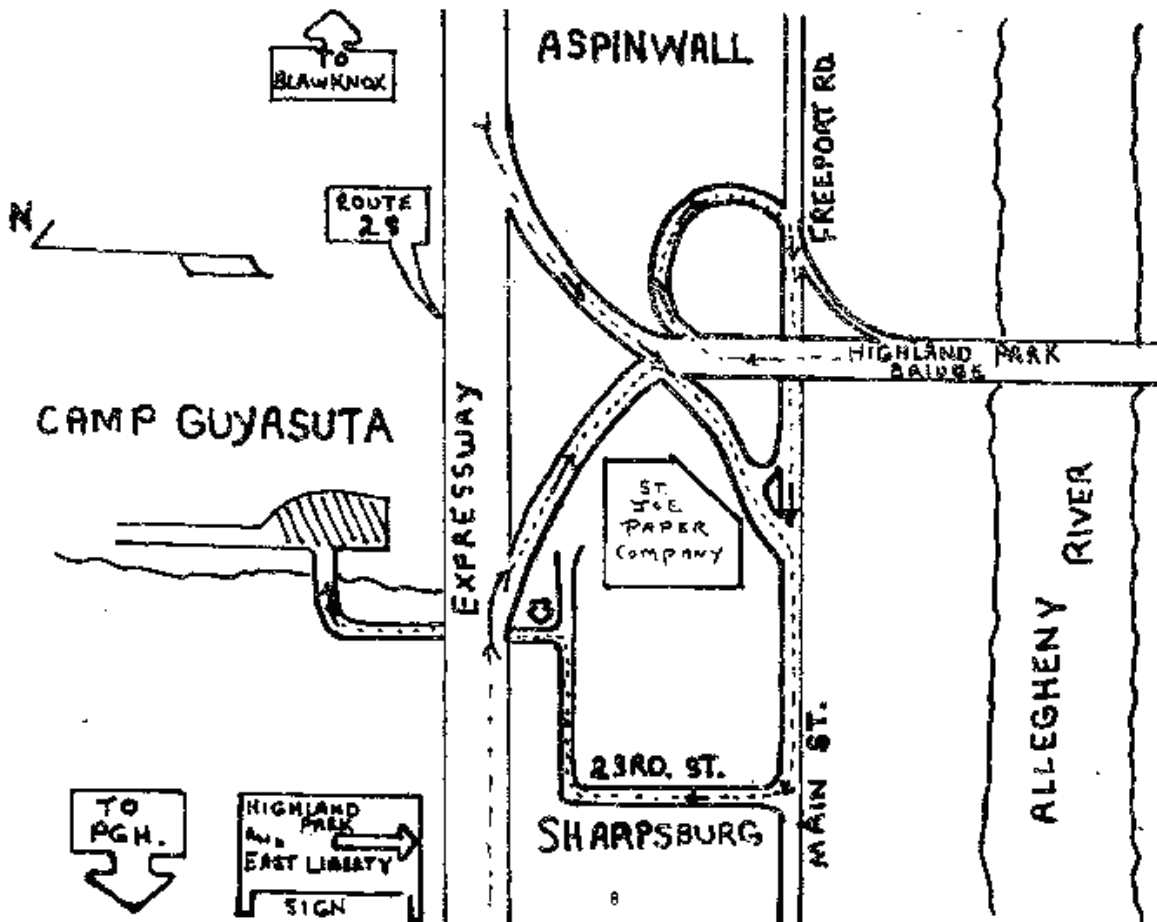
Take Parkway towards Pittsburgh.
Through Fort Pitt Tunnel. Get in Left lane.
Follow signs for 279 North to Ft. Duquense Bridge, Get in Right lane on bridge.

Follow signs to 28N. Stay on 28 N.
Take the Highland Park Bridge Exit.

Come off slow -- Stay in the right lane
immediately bear right on exit towards Sharpsburg. This will take you down to Main St. in Sharpsburg.

come down ramp, go one block, make a right onto 23rd Street
follow this street around to the sign that says:
"WELCOME TO CAMP GUYASUTA"
turn left driving under the highway

The first thing you will see is the New McGinnis Center
pass it bearing right.
follow the road around passing the Rangers house (slowly)
continue driving up to the parking lot
pull in & park - - our site is directly across the creek from the parking lot
