

Webelos (4th & 5th Grades or 10 & 11 Years Old)

I) Bobcat (Pages 41-42)

Every new Scout regardless of their entering rank must earn their Bobcat badge before receiving any other rank.



II) Webelo Trail (Pages 49 – 51)

Of the 8 requirements needed to earn the Webelo Rank, only #5 is based on the Webelo Activity Badges. Your Webelo must complete 3 activity badges; One must be the Fitness badge, one must be the Citizen badge, and one other badge of choice from a different activity group. Once he has made rank, there are 2 different badges available to choose from, please see your leader for details.



III) Activity Badges (Page 74)

There are 20 activity badges possible as a Webelo scout. Every activity badge completed is recognized with a pin. Note: These pins are different from the “Cub Scout Academics and Sports” pins. The pins can be placed on the plaid section of the hat or worn on the Webelo colors on the right shoulder. The activities are divided into 5 groups: Physical Skills, Mental Skills, Community, Technology, and Outdoor. Each group covers 4 activities. Fitness & Citizen are required for the Webelo Badge (rank) and Outdoorsman and Readyman are required for the Arrow of Light. A chart for tracking activities is located on page 75.

IV) Compass Point Emblem (Page 61)

After earning the Webelo badge, your Webelo can earn the Compass Point Emblem and 1st metal compass point. The emblem is awarded after 4 activity badges are completed. These are IN ADDITION to the 3 badges completed for rank. For every 4 badges completed another point will awarded.



V) The 20th Patch

Completing the Webelo badge and all 4 Compass Points is a total of 19 activities. If the last activity is also completed, a special patch is awarded for earning all 20 activity pins.

VI) Arrow of Light (Page 63)

The highest award in Cub Scouting, this is the only Cub Scout Badge that may be worn on the Boy Scout uniform. There are 7 requirements for this award. . When all requirements are met, a very special ceremony is held. It involves not only the Pack, but the Boy Scout Troop your scout has decided to cross over to as well.



VII) Additional Awards (pages 70-73)

More awards may be earned in addition to the Webelo Rank activities. Some of these are mentioned in the back of your book.
